

MANAGING YOUR MONEY & COMPUTER/SMARTPHONE POWER LOSS PREVENTION

1. Set up a Budget with your Parents before you leave.

- Monthly allowance from Rotary Club between \$50 and \$150 monthly.
- Host families will supply food and shelter.
- Your responsibilities clothing, personal items, cell phone, entertainment and travel.



2. Emergency Money

- Emergency Fund: Take at least \$500 (will vary by hosting District) emergency \$'s to be held by your host Rotary Club.
 - Can <u>pre-order new currency</u> from Fulton Bank.
 - Use only for <u>unexpected expenses</u> such as medical or unpaid bills when you leave.
- <u>Take some travel cash</u> (\$200 would be a good estimate) with you for your trip to your Country to cover unexpected travel expenses such as layovers, missed flights, food, etc...
- <u>Carry cash safely using an RFID safe money belt/pouch</u> concealed under clothing to protect against scanning and/or stealing.



3. Money from home (USA)

- Set up an account with a large bank that offers <u>EMV Card</u> that is chip compliant with student's name on card.
- Known large banks that are Internat'l and have EMV Card are:
 - BB&T, TD and BofA
 - BofA, Citibank and Wells Fargo
- The EMV card is thicker and heavier than non-chip cards
- <u>Discuss details with your USA banker</u> to set up the account
- <u>Credit cards are still the safest worldwide</u> and if setting up debit card – keep the amount in account low and consider having also a credit card for emergency purposes.

- Have EMV credit or debit card that is issued tied to this account for you to be able to access your money.
- Ask about fees for credit/debit cards as most are stopping or dropping charges/fees.
- Maintain a copy of your card with company phone numbers in case card would be lost or stolen – keep contact info separate from your original card.
- Most banks can wire transfers and can be initiated online
 but ask about costs as they are expensive
- Prior to exchange ask Host Rotary Officer about how the monthly stipend will be received – will they deposit in bank, or give cash etc.

COMPUTER LOSS PREVENTION

- Check the power requirements of your host country.(Volts & Hz)
- Check the power adaptor on your laptop.
 - (INPUT Volts, Hz & Watts)
- If a mis-match, then purchase a Power Converter to match the INPUT requirements of your laptop.
- If plug shape in host country is different, purchase plug adaptor.
