District Qualification & Stewardship



- ▶ To Participate in TRF Grants Program:
 - ► Governor, Governor-Elect, Governor Nominee, & the District Foundation Chair
 - District leaders must complete an online qualification process
 - Districts agree to follow and implement the financial and stewardship guidelines in the District Memorandum of Understanding
 - Must conduct a grants management seminar as part of the qualification process for clubs within the district

Club Qualification & Stewardship



- To participate in grants:
 - ► Clubs must complete annual qualification process to be eligible to apply for grants
 - ► At least one member must complete a district grants management seminar
 - Sign and follow the Club Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)
 - Club President & President-Elect



- ► Charitable Arm of Rotary International
- ► 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation
- ► Founded in 1917
- Supported solely by voluntary contributions
- ► The Rotary Foundation Board of Trustees



- ► The Rotary Foundation started with \$26.50. Grown to more than US\$1.3 billion.

- \$435 Million Donated in 2022-2023
- ► Funded 1092 Global Grants & 473 District Club Grants, & 324 Disaster Response Grants in 2022-2023

Unique Funding Model



- Annual Fund-Share is primary source for grant funding
- District leaders and Club members involved
 - District Governor and District Allocation Sub-Committee
 - **▶** District Grants Committee
 - Club Members



- Contributions to the Annual Fund-Share are key to a vibrant grants program
- Every Rotarian, Every Year is the fundraising initiative designed to support Annual Fund
- Contribute at least \$100 per member annually

DISTRICT 7390 ANNUAL FUND-SHARE

- ▶ District Membership ~~ 1758
 - @ \$100 generates \$175,800
- *Not all members donate. *Less members.
- *Must grow Annual Fund Share contributions.

Unique Funding Model



Investment of Annual Fund-Share Dollars

- ▶ 5% is credited to Operating Expenses
- ▶ 47.5 percent credited to World Fund
- ► 47.5 percent credited to District Designated Fund
 - Invested for 3 Years

When Annual Fund-Share Dollars are returned to districts

> District Designated Funds (DDF)

District Designated Funds



Three Years Later District Designated Funds

- ▶ Up to 50% of DDF to District Club Block Grant
- > 50% to Global Grants, Global Grant Scholarships, Vocational Training Teams, Transfers for PolioPlus, Transfers for Peace Centers, Transfers for Disaster Response

Endowment Fund



- Annual payout from the Endowment Fund
- Added to District Designated Fund

Adjustments



- Additions to Global Grant DDF
 - ▶ Payout from Endowment Fund = \$11,000+
 - Carryover from Previous Year = \$????
- Expenditures from Global Grant DDF
 - ► Global Grant Scholarship = \$16,675
 - Transfer to PolioPlus = 20 percent of DDF*
 - *(recommended by Trustees ~ district decides)

World Fund



TRF will provide 80 percent World Fund match for DDF allocated to a Global Grant

District Designated Funds



- Unused DDF are rolled over to the next year
- Starting July 1, 2026, DDF that has not been used for 5 years will be directed to the World Fund or
- Districts may request unused funds go to PolioPlus, to support Rotary Peace Centers, an Area of Focus, or to Disaster Response Fund
